

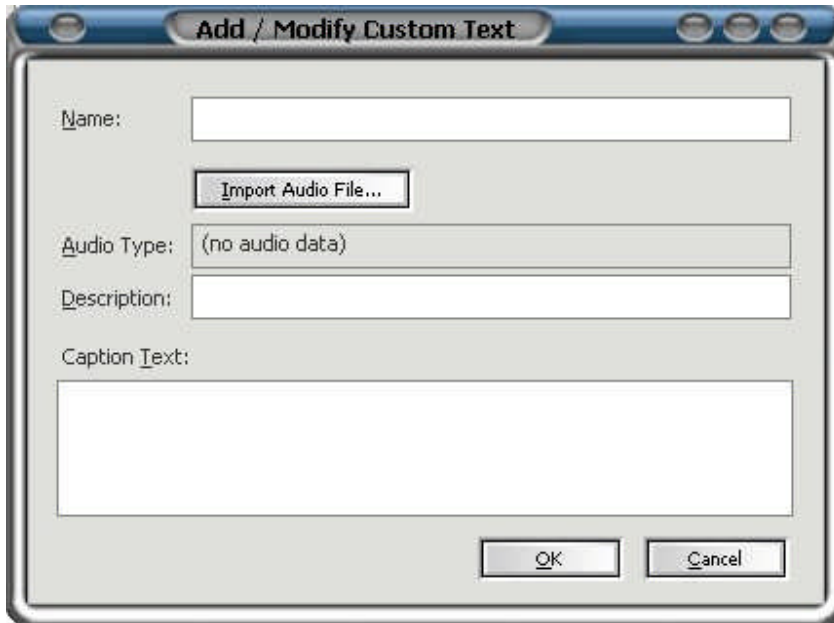

Captioned Audio Overview

Overview

Captioned Audio allows NexTalk users to import audio files for use in call flow scripts. For example,



Imported audio files can be associated with a text caption. In this way, users can tell the content of the audio file. Captioned audio files are owned by users or groups.

Options

Menu Bar

File | Close

This option closes the Captioned Audio module.

View | Always on Top

This option keeps the Captioned Audio window in front of all other open windows.

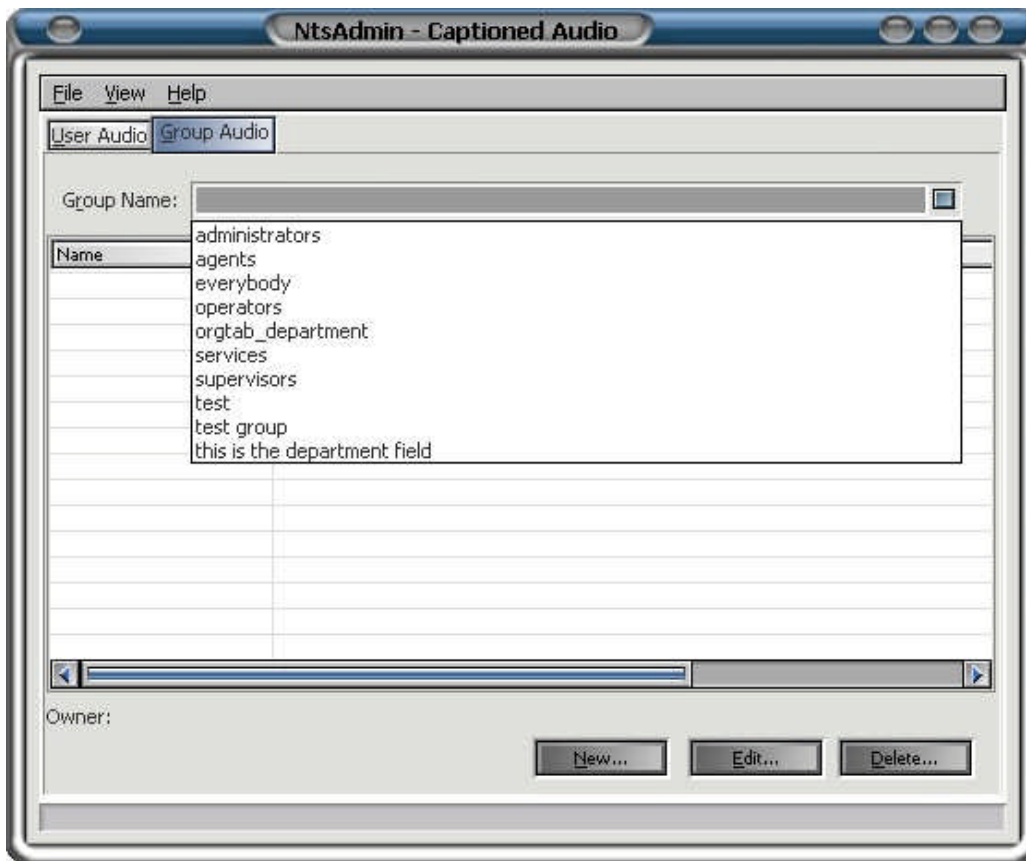
Create Captioned Audio

Create Captioned Audio

Open the Captioned Audio module from the Admin menu. To manage user owned captioned audio files, go to the User Audio tab.

Enter a username in the Login Name space and choose the Retrieve button. Existing captioned audio files owned by that user will be listed in the main table.


To manage group owned captioned audio files, go to the Group Audio tab.



Enter the name of the group in the Group Name space or select the group name from the drop down menu provided. Existing captioned audio files owned by the selected group will be listed in the main table.

To add a new captioned audio file, choose the New button. The Add/Modify Captioned Audio window will pop up.

Type in a name for the audio file and choose the Import Audio File button. Browse your computer to find the appropriate audio file and choose Open. You can optionally describe the captioned audio file in the Description box. Enter the caption text to accompany the audio file in the Caption Text box. When you are finished, choose the OK button. The new captioned audio file will appear in the main table.
